Mission

To prevent suicide and ensure the healthy development of all youth through powerful communication and education on gender and orientation.

Dear Friends,

I came to YES Institute about eight years ago. I called them seeking support and guidance about what to do or how to help my 'gender non-conforming' little boy, before I even knew that term. To me, he was a magical



little unicorn baby who sparkled and twirled and wanted to wear a dress.

My little human rainbow. A blessing. But from the world around us we were getting the message that he wasn't "normal." I didn't know how to let him be who he is and keep him safe. I spoke to staff over the phone, then I came to take their courses and kept coming until I had taken them all. It was my son that led me to YES all those years ago. I came in a Mama Bear and stayed for our youth.

In my naivety I couldn't fathom that not everyone accepts their child. I learned how youth are, or sadly are not, free to be themselves - or perhaps and this hurts this Mama's heart to even say - have to choose between who they are and having a family or being housed or loved or accepted or just safe....or even staying alive.

I am and always will be here because of the indelible pain that suicide leaves. I believe that suicide is a permanent decision often based on temporary feelings and I believe that YES Institute saves lives in a unique, profound, and vital way. I am a YES Institute supporter because I believe in the work and the people who deliver it.

I am and always will be in awe of YES Institute's impact and their ability to reach, communicate with, often heal and to always hear EVERYONE. The YES Institute does magic, they just don't call it that.

Young Men's Preparatory Academy

YES Institute led dialogues on masculinity in the private and public sector, with a vast majority of inquiries pouring in from school systems. Miami-Dade County Public School teachers, counselors, and administrators explored the ways in which they relate to their students specifically around gender expectations. One of the teachers shared that they learned how to better support their male students emotionally in ways they had not considered before.


During a dialogue on suicide prevention among Black and Hispanic young men, one youth participant shared that he learned creative ways to reach out to people, noting that certain emotions were viewed as a sign of weakness – even though he desperately wanted to be vulnerable and open up.

At the Young Men's Preparatory Academy, students shared that discussing their mental and emotional health is incredibly taboo and frowned upon. Being tough, angry, and sometimes violent was far more acceptable than crying when upset.

In-depth inquiry in our dialogues uncovers the correlation between the stigma of mental health and mass shootings through the lens of gender, specifically masculinity.

According to the Violence Project, 98% of mass shooters over the last 50 years have been men.

By examining the constraints of masculinity, participants can become aware of the way gender impacts their lives individually and on a global level.

School communities often ask what they can do for their students, especially for those who are experiencing bullying behaviors, navigating gender and orientation, and challenges communicating.

YES Institute has been invited to facilitate dialogues to private and public school parents, students, administration, and after-school enrichment programs. Our education team also led multiple bilingual workshops for faith-based parental groups.



On World Mental Health Day, YES Institute was invited to participate in mental health fairs at two South Florida high schools.

Our team also led a bilingual discussion for parents where they shared their concerns around a notable increase in depression and anxiety with their own children. One mother noted she did not know what to do with her daughter or who to talk to as her self-esteem was worsening. YES Institute was there to directly link her to community resources.

Our Executive Director, Joseph Zolobczuk shared his thoughts on the mental health impact from the Club Q shooting with the Miami New Times. "We hear from therapists because we work with, train and refer a lot of our youth, parents, and families to mental health therapists. They are all overbooked."

YES Institute is now serving on the Recovery-Oriented System of Care (ROSC) steering committee through Thriving Mind South Florida.

ROSC is a wellness-focused framework of care that centers the whole person and their strengths.
